- The situation in Myanmar remains critical and fragile, and growing violence from all armed groups is a major concern;
- The Five-Point Consensus shall be retained with an implementation plan that outlies concrete, practical and time-bound actions. To task ASEAN Secretariat to draft the implementation plan;
- To ask all concerned parties to adhere to the Five-Point Consensus. Engagement would be done in a flexible and informal manner;
- Myanmar's non-political representation shall be applied only for the ASEAN Summits and the ASEAN Foreign Ministers' Meeting, while other ministerial meetings shall maintain the status quo;
- Decision-making in ASEAN shall be based on consensus and consultation, and all the fundamental principles in the ASEAN Charter shall be safeguarded;
- 6. All concerned parties that bear arms shall be fairly held accountable and condemned for violence; call for utmost restraint from all sides.
- The Secretary-General of ASEAN and the AHA Centre shall be empowered with some degree of autonomy for a specific period of time in order to facilitate the humanitarian assistance in Myanmar;
- 8. A strategic reverse implementation approach was suggested to try to find converging points between the two separate parallel tracks of the 5-Point Consensus and 5-Point Roadmap, without compromising ASEAN position, and use that as a means to move forward the 5PC. The ASEAN SOM were tasked to discuss further;
- 9. ASEAN is safer and stronger with Myanmar being part of the family, and failing to solve the political crisis will create an opening for external actors' interference;
- 10. The 3<sup>rd</sup> visit of the Special Envoy shall be based on the recommendations decided by the leaders at the 40<sup>th</sup> and 41<sup>st</sup> ASEAN Summit;
- 11. ASEAN shall take advantage of the window of opportunity created by the Special Envoy with regards to engagement of individuals or entities labelled by the State Administration Council (SAC) as terrorists in the peace process and engage Myanmar at political level to push forward a dialogue process.
